
We have such an impressive and diverse list, and since good friends share good books, we invite you to get comfortable with all your pals (the fuzzy ones too) and enjoy them all!



Mama's going to teach them how to hide so six little sticks stay safe outside.



For kids aged 3–7, this lyrical picture book explores the complex emotions around missing a loved one, with stunning illustrations by Ojibwe artist Maya McKibbin.

I wish you were here... in this great big meadow like a sea of lacy clouds...

IN THIS BEAUTIFUL ode to nature and mindfulness, a child sets out to explore the environment around their home, using all their senses. Yet, someone important is missing, someone the child wishes could be there on the journey.

Rhythmic text by Kathy Stinson leaves room for readers' own interpretations about who the child in the story might be missing, while illustrator Maya McKibbin's gorgeous images capture the lush beauty of the natural world and the tenderness of a child's emotions.

KATHY STINSON has loved reading all her life but was almost thirty before she discovered she loved writing too. *If You Were Here* began with something she wrote for someone unable to join her for a walk on a beach in Scotland more than twenty-five years ago. She is the author of more than forty picture books, including *Red Is Best*.

MAYA MCKIBBIN is a Two-Spirited Ojibwe and Irish filmmaker, illustrator, and indie game artist. They grew up in shíshálh and later in the South West of England. McKibbin has illustrated acclaimed children's books, including *The Song That Called Them Home* by David A. Robertson.

LEO AND KIMBO are best friends. Despite living on opposite sides of the city, they meet almost every day. But today is a very special day: it's Kimbo's birthday!



MARTINA TRACH is an Argentine illustrator, muralist, and compulsive maker of drawings. She has illustrated a number of books, some of them nonfiction. One of her books, *Puberty in Motion*, was selected for the White Ravens—a list of the world's best books organized by the International Youth Library.



SHOSHANNAH GREENE is a Haida artist from British Columbia. Greene is a two-time Emerging Artist Scholarship recipient and has received a Bill McLennan Masterpiece Study Program travel grant to attend the Field Museum in Chicago, Illinois, and a microgrant to support research at the Canadian Museum of History in Gatineau, Quebec.

PETER LEECH is a former professional hockey player and member of the T'it'q'et Community Village of the St'át'imc Tribal Nation who specializes in working with First Nations communities and organizations, public and private sector companies, individuals, teams, and youth in all aspects of life. Peter is also a very proud and loving husband and father of three.
